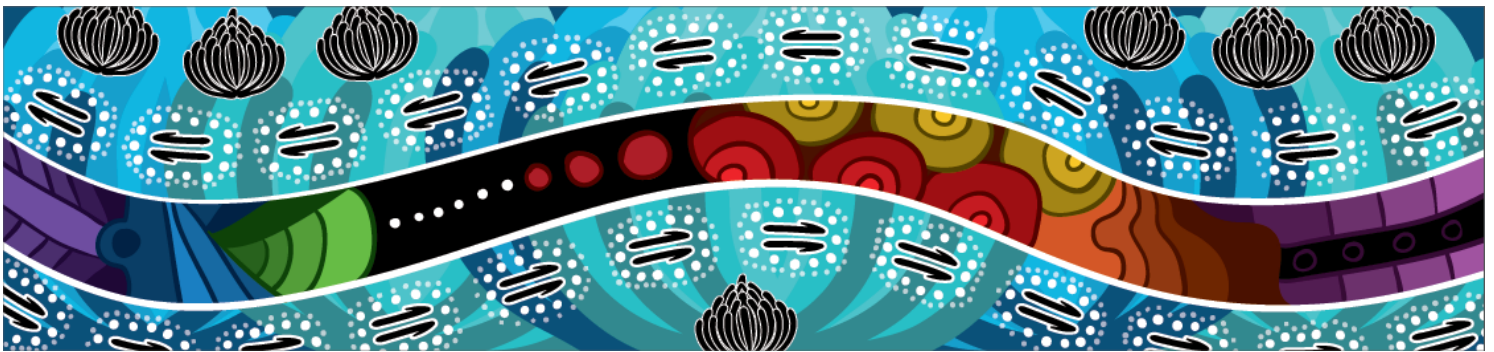


# Report on the 2019 NSW Aboriginal Land Council election

## Artwork

The cover artwork was designed by Jordon Lovegrove. It represents the voting experience of Aboriginal people in NSW.

The Waratah is the floral emblem of New South Wales. The pathway running through the artwork represents the different areas that people come from to vote. The kangaroo prints along each side of the pathway represent the journey some Aboriginal people make to vote. The white dots along each side of the kangaroo paws signify that they have special purpose providing inspiration for Aboriginal people to have their say by voting at elections.

# Election overview

The NSW Aboriginal Land Council election is held every four years to elect nine councillors – one for each of the nine Aboriginal Land Council regions across New South Wales. Councillors are elected to serve a four-year term.

Nominations opened for the 2019 Aboriginal Land Council election on Tuesday, 8 October 2019 and closed at 12noon on Tuesday, 5 November 2019. Fifty-one candidates nominated across the nine NSW Aboriginal Land Council regions.

Following the close of nominations only one nomination was received for the position of councillor for Northern Region. In accordance with clause 46 of the *Aboriginal Land Rights Regulation 2014*, Charles Lynch was declared elected for Northern Region on 5 November 2019.

Eight councillors were elected – one each for Central, Mid North Coast, North Coast, North Western, South Coast, Sydney/Newcastle, Western and Wiradjuri regions.

# Legislative changes

Prior to the election a number of amendments were made to the *Aboriginal Land Rights Regulation 2014* to improve election processes and bring them into line with State and Local Government election practices.

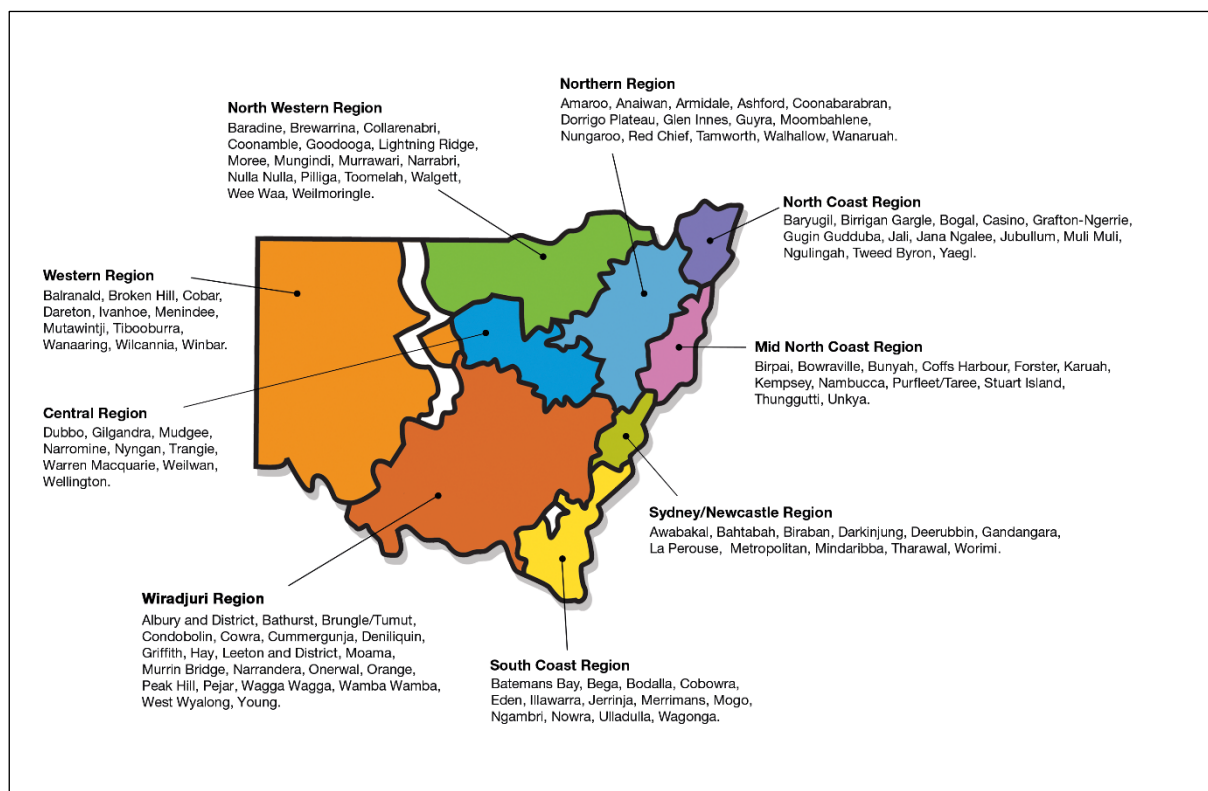

# Aboriginal Land Council regions

The network of 120 Local Aboriginal Land Councils (LALCs) is divided into nine regions. The number of LALCs within each region ranges from nine to 21. Each of the nine regions saw enrolment increase from the 2015 election to the 2019 election (see Table 4).

## Northern Region

### Northern Region election summary

Following the close of nominations at 12noon, Tuesday, 5 November 2019 only one nomination was received for the position of Councillor for Northern Region. In accordance with clause 46 of the *Aboriginal Land Rights Regulation 2014*, Charles Lynch was declared elected. The number of enrolled electors in Northern Region increased from 1,708 for the 2015 election to 1,986 for the 2019 election (an increase of 16.28 per cent).

# Election administration

Section 122(2) of the *Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983* requires the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, in consultation with the NSW Aboriginal Land Council, to determine a date for the election of councillors and to notify the returning officer of that date.

In a letter dated 28 February 2019, the Hon, Sarah Mitchell, MLC, the then Minister for Aboriginal Affairs advised that an election for the nine Regional Aboriginal Land Council regions would be held on Saturday, 30 November 2019.

The election was conducted by the NSW Electoral Commission in accordance with the provisions of the *Aboriginal Lands Right Act 1983* and the *Aboriginal Land Rights Regulation 2014*.

## Method of voting

The election was conducted using the optional preferential voting system. Voters were required to show preferences for at least one candidate; however, they could continue to give preferences to as many of the remaining candidates as they wished.

## Candidate resources

The NSW Electoral Commission provided a help desk for candidates with enquiries on the electoral process. A handbook for candidates and scrutineers provided election-related information, including nominations, electoral material, certified rolls, voting, and counting and results.

## Advertising

The election advertising campaign consisted of:

- NSW Aboriginal Land Council specific statutory advertisements placed in the print and online versions of the Koori Mail
- an election information brochure mailed to every voting member
- a letter and postal vote application form mailed to every voting member
- social media.

Copies of the Koori Mail newspaper advertisements can be found at Appendix A.

## Electoral brochure

A brochure was mailed to each enrolled elector in the eight contested regions, containing information specific to their enrolled NSW Aboriginal Land Council region. The brochure served as a direct communication with electors, containing key election dates, voting options, a list of polling place locations and other information specific to their region. A copy of the brochure for each region can be found at Appendix B.

## Postal vote application

As part of an initiative to increase voter participation requested by the NSW Aboriginal Land Council, a postal vote application was sent to each enrolled elector in the eight contested regions; 17,300 letters were posted on 14 October 2019.

The postal vote application form was accompanied by a letter from the NSW Electoral Commission detailing how to vote in the election and a letter from the Aboriginal Land Council encouraging voter participation.

The total number of postal vote applications received in 2019 was 906 (compared with 812 for the 2015 election). A summary of the postal votes is shown at Appendix G.

## Election staff

### Targeted recruitment strategy

The NSW Electoral Commission developed a targeted strategy for the recruitment of staff to work at the 2019 Aboriginal Land Council election. The aim was to prioritise the selection of applicants who identified as Aboriginal. Previous experience working in elections was not required. The NSW Electoral Commission worked with the Australian Electoral Commission, Queensland Electoral Commission, Australian Bureau of Statistics, NSW Aboriginal Land Council, Local Aboriginal Land Councils, universities, colleges, local councils and other relevant organisations to promote recruitment opportunities for Aboriginal people. The NSW Electoral Commission also supported the recruitment campaign with social media communications.

Application for work was via an online expression of interest. Applicants were directed to the NSW Electoral Commission website for information about the jobs available and the recruitment process, supported by an employment help desk (telephone and email) throughout the recruitment cycle. Recruitment of all staff was managed centrally in NSW Electoral Commission head office.

For the 2019 NSW Aboriginal Land Council election:

- 70 per cent of applicants identified as being Aboriginal
- 80 percent of staff who worked at the election identified as being Aboriginal
- 28 per cent of the election staff had no previous election work experience and also identified as being Aboriginal
- 288 election officials were employed at polling places
- 100 election officials were employed at regional electoral offices and additional pre-poll locations.

Nine regional electoral officers were selected from the NSW Electoral Commission's senior election official talent pool. The selection of each regional electoral officer was based on the proximity to the regional electoral office, with preference given to applicants who identified as Aboriginal or who had experience in working with Aboriginal communities.

A regional officer support officer selected from the NSW Electoral Commission's senior election official talent pool was located at the NSW Electoral Commission head office, providing advice and support on process and procedure to all regional electoral officers.

Office assistants and senior office assistants were employed before and/or after election day to provide administrative support to regional electoral officers and to work at the pre-poll locations.

Polling place managers and election officials were recruited to work on election day. These roles were required to set-up polling places, issue ballot papers, assist electors, sort and count ballot papers and decommission the polling place.

## Staff training

Training focussed on the key competencies of each role and was primarily delivered online, with all roles having compulsory online modules. The online program enabled staff to practice their skills and reflect on their learnings via question and answer modules. The modules were short and informative, not exceeding 10 minutes each. Staff could access all modules as many times as they wished and in any order, enabling the training to be self-directed.

Participants were surveyed at the completion of the training program. Over 90 per cent of survey respondents answered “strongly agree” or “agree” when asked their level of agreement with the training being easy to navigate, useful, engaging and prepared them for their role.

Training for the regional electoral officers was conducted face to face by the NSW Electoral Commission in a two-day program. This provided the opportunity for participants to practice the critical tasks of each role. A cultural appreciation workshop was facilitated by an external provider.

The NSW Electoral Commission provided coaching over the phone to 57 polling place managers and senior office assistants who were located more than two hours from a regional electoral office. Again, survey feedback was positive, with over 90 per cent of respondents answering “strongly agree” or “agree” that the training or coaching was well prepared, well organised, and provided them with the confidence, knowledge and practical experience to undertake their role.

## Returning officer

Mr John Schmidt, the Electoral Commissioner for New South Wales, was the returning officer for the 2019 NSW Aboriginal Land Council election. The returning officer’s office for NSW Aboriginal Land Council was located at the NSW Electoral Commission, Level 25, 201 Kent Street, Sydney NSW 2001.

### Returning officer duties

The returning officer’s operational responsibilities included:

- recruitment of staff to assist in the conduct of the election
- appointment of regional electoral officers
- election advertising
- preparation and distribution of the regional roll of electors
- receipt of nominations from candidates
- conduct of draw for ballot paper positions
- dealing with enquiries from general public, electors and candidates
- managing the issue/distribution of postal votes
- securing venues for pre-poll voting
- securing venues for polling places
- employing polling place managers and election officials
- preparing procedure documentation for polling place managers
- receiving and recording of polling place results
- responding to complaints
- advising the Minister, the Chief Executive Officer of the NSW Aboriginal Land Council and candidates of the result of the election
- declaring the result of the election.

## NSW Electoral Commission website

The NSW Electoral Commission published up-to-date and accessible information for the 2019 NSW Aboriginal Land Council election on its website. This information included:

- election timetable
- nomination forms
- candidate handbook
- candidate details
- postal voting
- pre-poll voting
- polling places
- working at the election
- election results.

Pre-poll and polling place venue information provided on the website included accessibility information for electors with a disability. The website saw considerable traffic seeking election work-related information. The *Work at this election* page for the 2019 Aboriginal Land Council election had 299 views. The polling place manager role description had 128 total clicks and 114 unique clicks (that is, 114 people viewed it 128 times). The election official role description had 144 total clicks and 123 unique clicks (that is, 123 people viewed it 144 times).

## Voting roll

NSW Aboriginal Land Council enrolment and voting are not compulsory. The voting roll closed 14 clear days and not later than 21 clear days after notice had been given of the election. There were 17,412 electors enrolled across the nine regions, with 15,426 electors on the voting rolls for the eight contested NSW Aboriginal Land Council regions.

## Nominations

Nominations for the New South Wales Aboriginal Land Council election opened on Tuesday, 8 October 2019. People intending to run as a candidate for one of nine regional councillor positions were required to have their nomination forms received by the returning officer no later than 12noon on Tuesday, 5 November 2019 (the close of nominations).

As part of the nomination process, candidates were required to pay a nomination deposit of \$50 to the returning officer at the time of nomination. The nomination deposit was refunded to candidates if: a candidate was elected, or received at least 4% of the total first preference votes, or the election was uncontested.

Any errors on nomination forms or accompanying materials not corrected by the close of nominations meant that the nomination would be rejected.

## Ballot paper draw

The returning officer conducted a draw on Wednesday, 6 November 2019 to determine the order of candidates on the ballot paper for each region. The ballot papers for each region were printed in Sydney by the NSW Electoral Commission's preferred secure printer with the ballot papers being produced with a security background. The ballot paper draw was live streamed for people who could not attend in person. A copy of the ballot papers for each region is at Appendix C.

## Vote types

### Early voting

#### Postal voting

Postal voting was made available as an alternative to voting on polling day and required a written or online application to be made to the returning officer.

#### Pre-poll voting

The 2019 election was the first time pre-poll was offered to electors during an Aboriginal Land Council election. There were 35 locations across New South Wales including regional electoral offices. Pre-poll operates to enable electors to cast their vote prior to election day.

## Polling day voting

Two types of votes were distributed to electors on polling day. The type of vote the elector received was determined by their individual circumstances:

- ordinary vote – issued to an elector whose name and address was on the voting roll at the polling place
- disputed vote – issued to electors who attended a pre-poll venue or polling place and were unable to vote for one of the following reasons:
  - marked on the roll as having voted but claimed not to have voted
  - had been issued with a postal vote but claimed to not have applied
  - name not on the roll but the elector claimed to be eligible to be included on the roll.

## Polling places

Where possible, the NSW Electoral Commission leased wheelchair accessible venues as polling places. While the NSW Electoral Commission does not own any of the venues used for voting it is committed to providing the best possible voting facilities for electors with a disability and understands the importance of providing accurate accessibility information to the public.

All polling places in all regions were open to electors from 8am to 6pm on election day. A list of the polling places used and their accessibility can be found at Appendix D.

## Counting the votes

### Counting procedures

Votes for NSW Aboriginal Land Council election of councillor were counted using the optional preferential method. This is a voting system in which an elector indicates by numbers their preferences for individual candidates or groups of candidates. It is not necessary to show a preference for every candidate or group listed on the ballot paper.

All ballot papers underwent an initial count and a check count. The check count is the official count that is used to conduct the distribution of preferences to determine the elected candidate in each region.

## Election night

Following the close of poll at 6pm on election day, all polling places conducted an initial count of first preference votes. On conclusion of these counts, the results were phoned through to each regional electoral officer and the results published on the NSW Electoral Commission website.

Postal vote counts were conducted from the Sunday after election day. Regional electoral officers counted pre-poll votes on election night in their office.

## Sunday check count

On the Sunday after election day the regional electoral officer for each region conducted a check count of all the ballot papers counted on election night.

The final results from the check count for each region when completed were published on the NSW Electoral Commission website. The check count was conducted at the office of the regional electoral officer, with scrutineers able to attend. The first preference counts for each region are shown in Appendix E.

## Distribution of preferences

Leeanne Hampton, a candidate in Wiradjuri Region obtained an absolute majority (50 per cent +1) of the total formal first preference votes and a distribution of preferences was not required in this region. Ms Hampton was declared elected on 6 December 2019.

In each of the remaining seven regions no candidate obtained an absolute majority of the total formal first preference votes. The distribution of preferences in each of these seven regions was undertaken on the 5 December 2019. The distribution of preference results for each region are shown in Appendix F. The results were declared on 6 December 2019.

## Election results

The results were published on the NSW Electoral Commission's website in a series of two reports:

1. first preference vote reports for each region (available after 6pm on election day, Saturday 30 November 2019)
2. distribution of preferences reports for each region (available on Thursday, 5 December 2019).

## First preference votes

Ballot papers were counted from 6pm on election night up to the close of postal voting at 6pm on Wednesday, 4 December 2019.

## Distribution of preferences

The distribution of preferences, if required, is conducted to determine who is to be elected. The distribution of preferences for the 2019 NSW Aboriginal Land Council election took place at each regional electoral officer's office on Thursday, 5 December 2019.

## Declaration of the poll

On Friday 6 December 2019, the returning officer declared the election for the NSW Aboriginal Land Council for all nine regions. The returning officer advised the Chief Executive Officer of the NSW Aboriginal Land Council of the elected candidates in writing on Friday, 6 December 2019. In addition, the returning officer advised all candidates either by phone, email or SMS that the election results were available on the NSW Electoral Commission's website. A copy of the Declaration of Poll is shown at Appendix H.

Notification of the election result was also sent to Registrar *Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983* and the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs.

## Election costs

As prescribed in the *Aboriginal Lands Right Act 1983* and the *Aboriginal Land Rights Regulation 2014* the Electoral Commissioner conducts the election on behalf of NSW Aboriginal Land Council on a full cost recovery basis. The election requires 'face-to-face' voting on a State-wide basis, which involves considerable organisation and resourcing. The NSW Electoral Commission is not funded by the NSW State Government for the conduct of the election.

Key costs for the election included:


- election official wages
- information technology support
- hiring of polling places and regional returning officer offices
- newspaper advertising and elector brochure printing and postage
- supply of materials for polling places
- printing of ballot papers
- mileage and/or courier costs
- NSW Electoral Commission head office staff involved in the administration of the election.

The election cost approximately \$984,000 (excluding GST).
