APPROVAL OF MANNER AND FORM OF APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION OF ELECTORAL MATERIAL

- 1. Pursuant to section 199(7) and section 4 of the *Electoral Act 2017*, the Electoral Commissioner is to approve the manner and form of an application for registration of electoral material.
- 2. I approve the form as set out in the Annexure as an approved manner and form of an application for registration of electoral material.
- 3. I further approve the form of the application made using the internet-based system known as the Registration of Electoral Material System, available at https://www.htv.elections.nsw.gov.au. Such an application may be made by:
 - a. creating an account for or logging in to the Registration of Electoral Material System
 by providing the required particulars and selecting the person or entity on whose
 behalf the application is being made; and
 - b. completing the application by
 - i. selecting the 'register electoral material' button;
 - ii. selecting the button indicating the applicant would like to register a flyer, brochure, pamphlet or how to vote card that will be distributed on election day;
 - iii. indicating where the electoral material is intended to be distributed by selecting 'all districts (statewide)' or specifying the relevant district/s;
 - iv. typing the name of the person by whom the electoral material was authorised;
 - v. selecting the contest types for which the electoral material is to be displayed on the NSW Electoral Commission website;
 - vi. selecting a button to indicate whether the material is to be distributed in declared facilities;
 - vii. selecting a button to indicate whether the material is accessible:
 - viii. uploading the electoral material;
 - ix. selecting a button to indicate whether the electoral material contains a language other than English; and
 - x. if the material contains a language other than English, uploading a translation of the electoral material and declaring the translation is accurate.

Application to register electoral material (how to vote cards) for distribution on election day NSW State election

The NSW Electoral Commission (NSWEC) has an online registration system for registration of electoral material at <u>elections.nsw.gov.au</u>. This form should only be used where an applicant cannot use the NSWEC registration system.

Instructions

- Complete part A, B, C and D. All parts excluding part A must be completed for each item of electoral material.
- Applications for registration may be made from the close of nominations, until 5pm, on the Friday that is 8 days before election day.
- You should not print electoral material for distribution on election day until you have received approval from the NSW Electoral Commission.
- It is an offence to distribute unregistered electoral material on election day.

Display of electoral material

Registered electoral material will be displayed on the NSW Electoral Commission website $\underline{\text{elections.nsw.gov.au}}$ from Monday two weeks prior to election day until 6.00pm on election day.

Electoral material that is registered during the first week of pre poll and prior to the closure of registration of electoral material will be progressively updated to the display of electoral material website.

Third-party campaigners

Any incorporated or unincorporated entity, trustee or individual (other than a registered party, an elected member, group, candidate or an associated entity of a registered party or elected member) who incurs electoral expenditure of more than \$2,000 during the capped expenditure period for the election, may be required to register as a third-party campaigner for the election.
